Why should we focus on the Psalms?

Two reasons...

- Passion
 - They are an expression of the passionate relationships the writers had with God and a signpost for us in our age.
- Worship
 - A blueprint and inspiration in both words and song to worship God

What are the Psalms?

- Not just a hymn book...
- Psalm 1 introduces the book as a new Torah (teaching)
- Forms: Poetry, Prayers, Songs
- Uses: Chants, Songs, Prayers and Meditation
- Unique entire book dedicated to talking to God
 - Hymns = Praise and Celebration
 - Laments = Calls in Pain, Anger and Despair

Where do they come from...?

- 150 Psalms organized in 5 books
- Written by:
 - **■** David **–** 73
 - Asaph 12
 - Sons of Korah 11
 - Solomon and Moses 3
 - Heman and Ethan 2
 - ► Anonymous 49
- Composed over about one thousand years from the time of Moses (about 1500 B.C.) to the time of Ezra (about 450 B.C.)
